2 MR. KOPCZYNSKI: We do not. Does Your Honor want to  
3 address the stipulation?

4 THE COURT: Yes.

5 MR. KOPCZYNSKI: Okay.

6 THE COURT: All right. So, members of the jury, there  
7 will be a stipulation reached by -- there is a stipulation  
8 reached by the parties, which will be Government Exhibit  
9 No. 215. That stipulation is as follows:

10 Mr. Shetty contends and the government does not contest  
11 that the banks at issue in this case did not require more than  
12 one authorized signer, to approve wire transfers.

13 Okay. The parties have agreed to certain facts, the facts  
14 that have just been stated to you, and those facts are now  
15 conclusively established.

16 MR. KOPCZYNSKI: Your Honor, with that matter  
17 addressed, the government rests.

18 THE COURT: And with this, given the time, we're going  
19 to let you go home a little bit early today.

20 All right. So as I indicated, since this trial started,  
21 you, as jurors, will decide this case, based solely on the  
22 evidence presented in this courtroom. This means that after you  
23 leave here for the night, you must not conduct any independent  
24 research about this case, the matters in the case, the legal  
25 issues in the case, or the individuals or other entities
